Christian Filostrat's fiction is rich and original, growing out of his experiences in the diplomatic corps at the U.S. Department of State. He appeals to the reader's intellect, yet fills the senses and shocks the emotions with stark scenes, as he did in *The Beggars' Pursuits* and *The Gospel of Thomas*. Filostrat is also the author of *Negritude Agonistes, Assimilation against Nationalism in the French-speaking Caribbean and Guyane*, a scholarly work.
